

## Wingham's Sensation.

Provincial Detective Rogers Appears on the Scene.

Summoning Witnesses for the London Inquest-Much Excitement.

Wingham, Ont., March 26.-The excitement over the Fields case is running very high. It is now over two weeks since the assault on Fields was committed, and those interested were beginning to think the authorities were not going to pay any attention to the matter. There was, however, a rude awakening yesterday, when Detective Rogers, of the Provincial Detective Department, appeared to subpoena witnesses to appear at the adjourned inquest to be held in London on March 31. Much uneasiness is felt by all in-

part in the assault, but went as on-When the assault was committed, the feeling here was that justice had been meted out to Fields. But when death occurred, a wave of horror swept over the community. 
