WINTER TRIPS ON
THE ST. LAWRENCE

The Government Ice-Breaker to
Test Practicability of
Navigation.

Quebec, Jan. 8.—The Government ice-
breaker Montcalm is under orders to make
three regular trips down the lower St.
Lawrence as far as Seven Islands and re-
turn this winter, in order to test the prac-
ticability of winter navigation. Besides
carrying a limited number of passengers,
the Montcalm will carry the mail for de-
livery at isolated stations along the north
shore, and urgent freight.

Experienced river men are of the opinion
that the Montcalm will have no difficulty,
though she will not have gas or other
buoys to steer by, but she will be afforded
protection by landmarks so well known
to the captains of the government steam-
ers and pilots that the passage will be en-
tirely safe.

The only real danger that need give con-
cern is the possibility of the ship being
developed in a snowstorm or northeast-
erly gale, but even this danger can be sur-
mounted by the Montcalm putting into
one of the many coves along the north
and south shores until the storm subsides.

The success of the Montcalm means the
framing of the lower St. Lawrence is prac-
tically by specially-constructed boats, has
made up his mind to experiment by putting
the ice-breaker on a regular ser-
vice of three trips during the present
winter.

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
