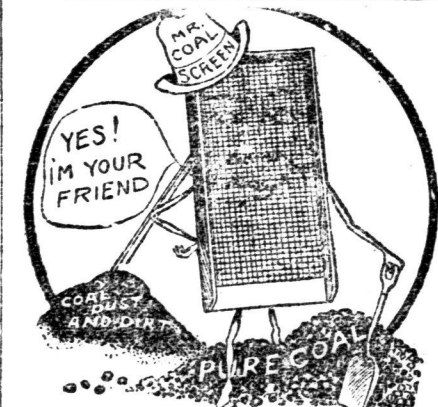

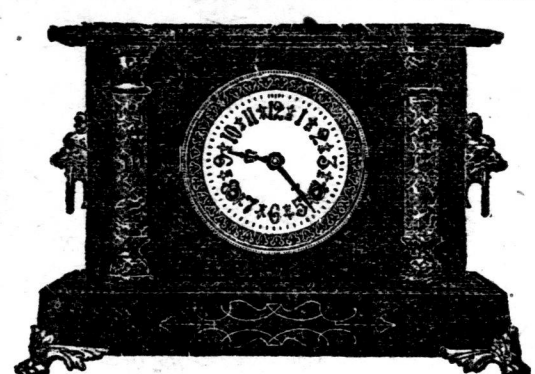

by messenger.

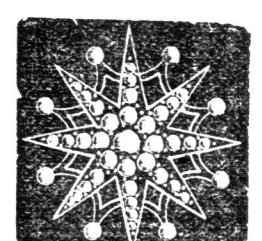
