GEORGIAN DAY GROCER KILLED FOR HIS MONEY

Robert Hayde's Body Found in Manure Pile—Missing Since March 27.

[Canadian Press.] Midland, April 7.—Robert Hayde, a grocer, of Tomahawk Point, two miles north of Honey Harbor, was murdered on or about the night of Friday, March 27. His body was found last night, buried in a manure pile near the stable of his home. There was a shot wound in the back of his neck, and the weapon had been fired close enough to singe the hair. Three men who were aiding in the search for Hayde found the body.

An inquest was formally opened today and adjourned until tomorrow at Midland. Hayde was a bachelor, about 50 years of age, and lived alone. On the day he disappeared (March 27) he was for a short time in Midland. For some days search was made for the body in the channels among the surrounding islands, as it was feared he might have dropped through a hole in the ice and been drowned.

The men who found the body were standing on the manure heap discussing what further steps should be taken in the search, when they noticed an unusual commotion in the pile, and made their search, with the above result. It is supposed he was murdered for his money, as he usually carried a considerable sum on his person.



LUCAS HAS NEW PLAN TO MEET BIG DEFICIT

Proposes Tax on Banks, Loan, Insurance and Other Companies.

Parliament Buildings, Toronto, April 7.—Following the lines indicated in his budget speech, Hon. I. B. Lucas, provincial treasurer, introduced into the Legislature today a bill to supplement the provincial revenue to the extent of \$600,000 or \$700,000.

The main features of the bill are an increase in the tax on banks, loan, insurance and trust companies, telephone and telegraph companies and railways. There is also an added tax on racing associations. On the paid-up capital of banks up to \$5,000,000 the tax is to be one-fifth of 1 per cent, and 50¢ on every \$100,000 in excess of this sum; \$500 for the head office and 50¢ for each branch located in the province. On the gross premium income of fire and life insurance companies the tax is raised from 1 per cent. to 1 1/2 per cent. in the case of other insurance companies it is two-thirds of 1 per cent.

Loan companies will pay one-eighth of 1 per cent. on the paid-up capital instead of one-twelfth per cent. Trust companies will be taxed 1 per cent. on the gross annual income in addition to one-fourth of 1 per cent. on the paid-up capital. Telegraph and telephone companies will pay one-fifth of 1 per cent. on the paid-up capital of \$1,000 for every 100 miles of line. Steam railways will suffer no increased tax on the mileage basis, but the gross annual revenue will be subject to an imposition of half of 1 per cent. This, Mr. Lucas expects to bring in a revenue of \$50,000. Electric railways will pay one-half of 1 per cent. calculated on the gross earnings. Where the tax on telephone companies does not exceed \$50 it will not be imposed. Race tracks will have their license raised from \$200 to \$500. Gas and electric light companies will pay 1 per cent. on the net revenue. Car companies will be asked to pay 1 per cent. on the capital invested in respect of dining, refrigerator, oil and freight cars used in their business.

DEMAND CUTTING OFF OF HURON LICENSES

Clinton, April 7.—At one of the most enthusiastic conventions yet held by the temperance workers of Huron County it was decided this afternoon to insist on the Government carrying out its promise to cut off all licenses on May 1. If this is not done the members were unanimous in declaring that war will be carried on against the members for South and Centre Huron. Mr. Proudfoot, it is known, will make every effort to have the licenses cancelled as far as he can. The temperance workers will send strong delegations to the meetings of the commissioners to be held on April 17 and 22 and will urge that they follow the example set by North Huron which has already given the hotelmen notice to quit on May 1. Rev. E. G. Powell, of Exeter, who accepted the appointment of secretary for Perth recently, on condition that Huron and Perth agreed to have a joint secretary, was named as secretary for Huron at a salary of \$1,500 per year and expenses. A vote was taken and it was decided that there will be plenty of work for Rev. Mr. Powell in Huron. He will therefore be compelled to not accept the offer made him by Perth.

LONDON BOYS IN TROUBLE

Break into Two Detroit Places and Destroy Property.

Detroit, Mich., April 7.—Chesley Roberts and Edward Brown, of London, Ont., each about 19 years old, pleaded guilty in Judge Mandell's Court Tuesday of breaking and entering in the day time. They broke into two houses on Grosvenor, owned by Mrs. Adelaide Clark and J. Haynes, of the Regal Motor Car Co., and defiled same, besides destroying property. In the second house they had made coffee and thrown what was left over the walls and ceiling, destroying beautiful wall paper. The United States authorities told the judge that as soon as he had disposed of the boys they would deport them to London.

"There is more of the beast than the man about you," the judge told them, "and I do not intend to let you now lest temper enter into it for your conduct would disgust any decent man. I will consider your case in two days."

FOUR GUNMEN MUST DIE

Y., April 7.—Governor Glynn tonight refused to either commute the death sentence of the four gunmen who were convicted of slaying Henry Rosenthal, or to grant them a reprieve until after the second trial of former police Lieutenant Becker. They now must die by electrocution in Sing Sing prison some time next week, probably Monday.

ANDERSON BILL TO FAIL

Toronto, April 7.—The bill introduced into the Legislature by Dr. C. N. Anderson, South Essex, to prevent the wholesale destruction of wild ducks is likely to be killed by the Government. When the bill came up in the fish and game committee today it was held over until Thursday on account of Dr. Anderson's absence in another committee, but The Advertiser understands that Dr. Reaume has made the fact plain that the bill cannot go in its present form, and it will likely be withdrawn.

It is suggested that something might be done by the department to limit the number of the bag, but the sale of ducks will not be prohibited.
