Sir Alfred Cope has arrived in America to make arrangements for Lloyd George's forthcoming trip to this continent.



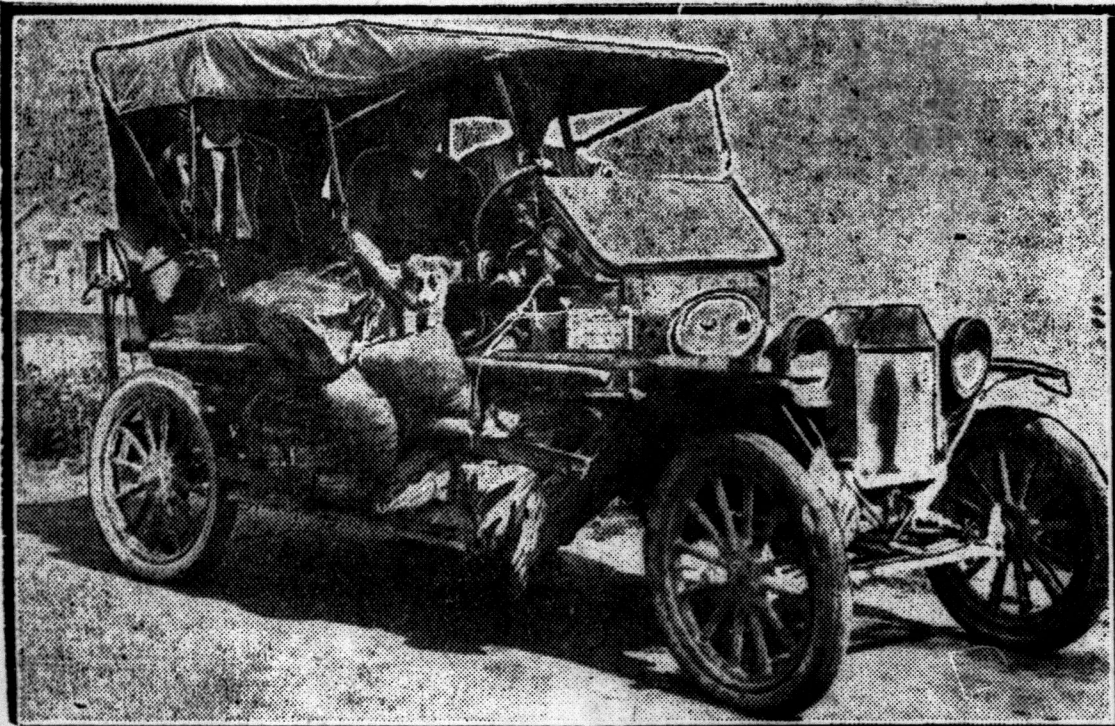

A war veteran of Ohio has started on a hike around the world with the aim of covering the distance in three years. His health is his reason.



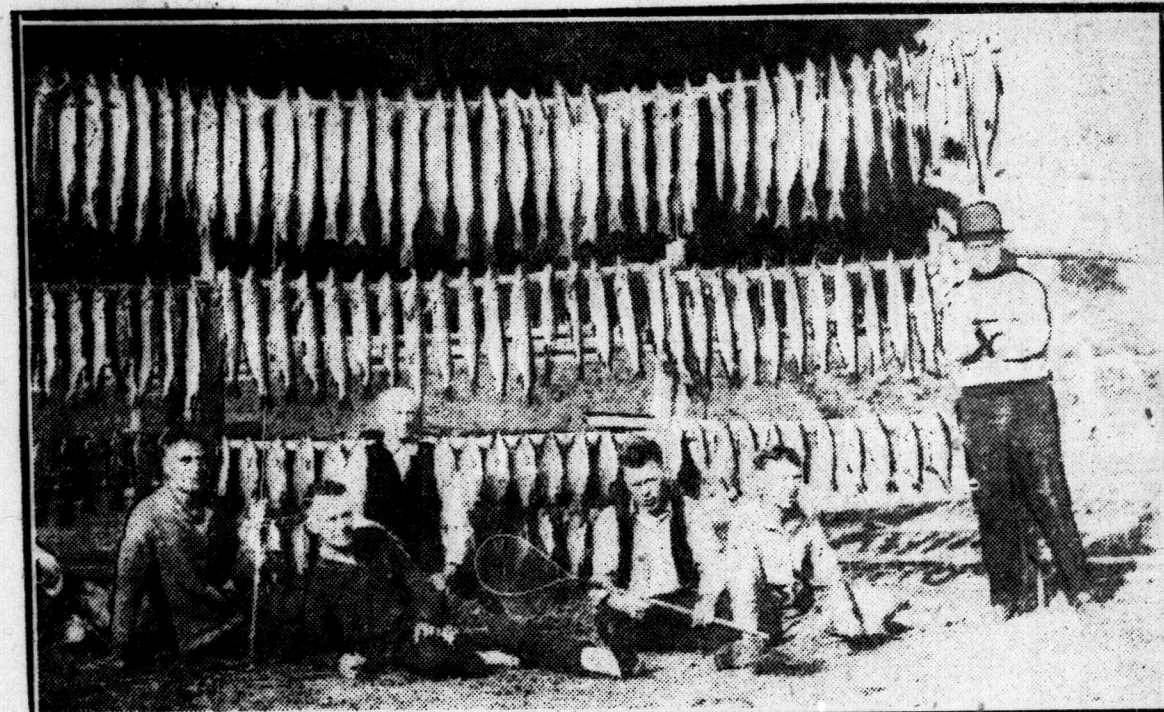
They have to pull the wool over the eyes of an ostrich so that his plumage may be clipped. Only when he is hooded does the bird submit to the operation.

"Mitzi" is an expert batswoman and is playing a wonderful game this season. She is the "Babe" Ruth of a Y.W.C.A. team.



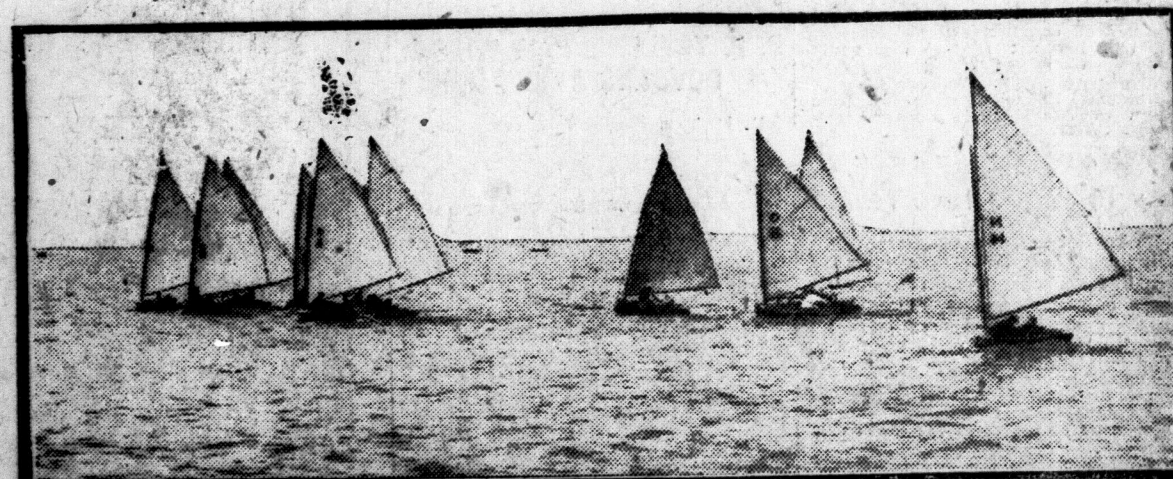
Lina Paglinghi, sixteen-year-old Italian girl of San Francisco, has been selected by Mme. Tetrassini to be educated under her supervision in Rome.
