Sergeant Austin Steeves for the past five years a member of the Mount Police force, has resigned from the C. N. R. Railway Investigation Department with headquarters at New Brunswick, taking the position recently vacated by Mr. Power.

**FUR ROYALTIES**  
The Provincial Government collected the sum of \$5,890.70 in fur royalties last year. According to Chief Game Warden Gagnon the catch consisted of 1070 moose, 15,886 weasels, 88 otters, 15 martens, 4605 skunks, 51 fisher, 16,061 muskrats, 81,78 mink, 66 bear, 6702 foxes and 1488 wild cats. No royalty was collected on wild cats, but on these animals a bounty of \$3 each was paid.

**FIVE STILLS SEIZED**  
Custom Excise Officer Stewart and Inspector Quinlan paid a visit to the residence of a man a few miles from Chatham on Friday, and returned with a load of stills, which had been seized. The outfit consisted of five large and up-to-date copper stills of about twenty gallon capacity, pure copper, with large cooling tubes and coils and strainers and other accessories. The stills were not in operation. Proceedings will be taken under the Inland Revenue Act.

## CHANGES AGREED TO IN BONSPIEL

of Four.

Bathurst, N. B., March 11.—A meeting of great importance to the North Shore curlers was held at the Nesquehott Hotel Tuesday afternoon when two delegates from each club met for the purpose of conducting the permanent ownership of the second trophy this season, it became necessary to secure a new cup. The delegates were as follows: R. A. Snowball, H. McKendry, Chatham; John Russell, R. C. Clark, Newcastle; J. E. Conolly, J. G. Stout, Bathurst; J. B. McKay, S. L. T. Clifford, Dalhousie; R. K. Shives, Thos. Wran, Campbellton.  
E. P. McKay, the bonspiel president, presided, and after considerable discussion it was decided for 1926 to reduce the play to a two rink contest from each club instead of four as heretofore.  
The entire play to take place two days at present. A new trophy will be purchased, also individual trophies for the members of the winning club. Another feature has been changed, the banquet which has been held in the past, is to be permanently done away with.
