The eclipse will be on at sunrise for our neighbors, the Aleutian islanders, and thus they will have a rare opportunity for a late map, for it will be dark with them after sunrise. From that point on the surface of the earth the line of the centre of the eclipse will sweep southward and eastward across the Pacific ocean, and will land on our western shores to the north of San Francisco. Across Nevada, Idaho and Montana the line will fall till it ends away up in Canada where there is nobody of consequence to observe it. It is expected that the results which will be gained by the observations of this eclipse will be better than have ever before been secured from any like event.

Harvard University has made great preparations for observations, and has sent out to California a large lot of apparatus. The expedition will take abt ut a month on the ground for preparations. The place for building the temporary observatory will be in the town called Willows, about 200 miles north of Sacramento, and from 200 to 300 feet above the level of the sea. This is not by any means a high altitude for such a purpose, but it is difficult to transport to a high point such a mass of apparatus as the university has sent out. The largest telescope in the possession of the university has an aperture of 15 inches, and this is too large to send out on such a trip, but the next in size, one of 13 inches, has been sent. This is much larger than any which has ever before been used for this purpose. Hitherto none have been used of more than six or seven inches. Now, the amount of light which falls upon the glass varies as the square of the diameter. Thus they combine accuracy of observation with permanence of result in a way wholly unknown to former methods of observation. It is not expected that any plates which are taken of the eclipse will be developed at Willows, but they will be brought out afterward at leisure, either in Cambridge or in Southern California, where the party will go when the eclipse is ever.
