The committee approved of a granolithic sidewalk in Spadina-avenue between St. Patrick and Clyde-streets, on the south side of Wellesley-street from Church to Jarvis and on the north side of Queen-street be-tween Yonge and Barkeley-streets; and an asphalt pavement in Beverley-street be-tween Queen and College-streets. "The recommendation for a brick pavement in Arthur-street between Bathurst and Palmerston-avenue was referred back in order that the Engineer may report on the desirability of laying street car tracks in Arthur-street from Bathurst to Dundas.
