This was the remark of Col. Denison in the Police Court yesterday in a case in which a farm pupil, Walter Greenwood, sued F. F. McArthur, Canadian superintendent of the International Emigration Association of London and Toronto, for \$21 wages. Greenwood had paid the association £21, for which they agreed to transport him to Canada and secure him a place on a farm at \$5 per month. He worked about five months with W. W. Robinson, a Norfolk farmer, who refused to pay him on the ground that his contract with McArthur was that the pupil should work six months for nothing. He had previously worked with a man named Murray for three months and was paid off with \$10. McArthur for explanation said he got \$15 for securing the applicant a place and when he had done so all responsibility ceased. The magistrate did not take this view of the case and McArthur was ordered to pay \$21 and costs within 20 days. osts within 20 days.
