Explosion at Petrolea.

Petrolea, July 7.—People who were en-joying a quiet Sunday afternoon rest were considerably startled this afternoon shortly after 3 o'clock, when a terrible explosion took place. The whole town was shaken and many windows were shattered shattered.

shattered. Upon investigation it was discovered that the building at the Bradley nitro-glycerine works had been completely wrecked. The building is located about a mile north of the town. The manager stated that in the building which was wrecked only a very small quantity of the explosive could have been present. Within less than a hundred yards of the building were two magazines, each containing several hundred quarts of nitro-glycerine. How they escaped de-struction is at present unknown, but had the glycerine stored in them exploded the effect would have been disastrous.

years in succession of good crops and great prosperity," he observes, "and un-der such circumstances it is quite natural to forget that it is possible to have poor crops


In the meantime crop prospects are improving all over the west. Sunday rain was general in Manitoba.
