SUMMER SCHOOL FOR TEACHERS
Classes for the Instruction of Those Holding Third-Class Certificates.

A special summer school of Normal School standard will be held in 1908, by which holders of permanent third-class certificates will be enabled to secure second-class status, providing the final examinations of the Normal Schools is taken and their success and ability as teachers are certified to by the inspector under whom they last taught. Only in cases of scarcity of teachers will third-class certificates be renewed in future, and then only on the application of the Inspector and for a period not longer in any case than until July, 1909.
