NOTE AND COMMENT

Fred. Gardner, a boilermaker, who addressed the industrial relations commission at Fort William the other day, is reported as saying that "increase of wages was of no use. As soon as wages rose, up went the price of grub. The speculators were watching wages, and shoving up prices so that they more than eat up any little increase." There is the beginning of wisdom in that statement. Wages are a large factor in production costs, and when wages are increased the prices of commodities are raised accordingly and the increased wages go no farther than before in purchasing goods. If more attention were given to the discovery of economic "leaks," and to their stoppage, real progress might be made in the problem of making their conditions easier. At present we are all just travelling in a circle.

Schools for Mothers a New Move in England

Under its new educational bill Great Britain is making provision for schools for mothers. The curriculum will include instruction in the management of the home, practical nursing, simple dietetics for babies and children, and kindred subjects. In connection with the schools there are to be established baby clinics and dispensaries. Medical service will be given without charge and in cases of need, food and medicines will be provided. The hope is expressed in England that these schools may become a permanent part of the system of adult education. Certainly nowhere else does help seem to be more greatly needed, for most of the mistakes for which the children are compelled to pay so dearly in after years, are solely the results of ignorance.
