To the Municipal Council of Annapolis.

GENTLEMEN:—I have the honor to submit the annual medical report of the Alma House of Annapolis County for the year 1898.

Number of admissions including two deaths 20 Discharged 20 Deaths 5 Present sum for each year 37 The deaths have taken place at the dates, and from causes as follows: March 17th, man, age 80, Bright's disease. May 25th, woman, age 74, chronic disease of heart. July 15th, man, age 81, debility and old age. Oct. 29th, man, age 60, paralysis and epilepsy. Dec. 21st, boy, age 12, consumption.

The mortality has been that in some years past and there has been no death from scarlet fever. The sanitary conditions of the buildings in general as good as can reasonably be expected in an institution of this description, and as far as cleanliness and good management are concerned, cannot be better.

The nursing and care of the sick and infirm have been well and kindly attended to by Mr. and Mrs. Lowe and I have to thank them for their efficient assistance which they have willingly rendered to me on all occasions. All of which was cordially appreciated. LOUIS G. DEBROS, M. D.
