## REFIET OF TIIE MOMTREAL MIBEETS.

Montreal, March 13th, 1858.
Although a few orders continue to be received, business continues dull and Auction sales go oft heavily. In Groceries there is an improved feeling. Dry Goods Stocks are already well assorted in anticipation of the Spring trade.

There is little doing at the Custom House, as most of the goods are going into bond.
Money continues quiet The small amount of business doing renders good commercial paper scarce and easily negociated. It cannot be said however, that the money market is ersy, and when our merchants are calted upon to pay duties on the goods now in liond, the present scarcity of money will be more severely felt.

Sugars-Bright Muscavado bas not been rery plenty, and fair has readily brought $\$ 7,50$, while inferior has been sold as low as $\$ 6,75$ to $\$ 7$. Montreal Refined is quoted as follows:-Ground 12c ; Extra do. 12ly ; Crushed A, 11c ; Yellow, se to 10c ; Sugar House Syrup, 50, 40, 35c. No Loaf or Dry Crusbed.

Molasses and Sybep continue as formerly quoted.
Teas are not in much request. Some lots of Twankey hare, bowerer, changed hauds at 30 cents for inferior, 33 to 34 cents for fiae, and 35 to 40 cents for Hyson skin.

Cofree has rather improved during the week. Sales of good Rio have been easily made at 8 d per lb ., and as high as ls has been paid for Java.

Fretr-Raisins have advanced during the week, 10 to 20 cents per box.
Salt and Fisif have ruled low this winter, the quality of the latter has been generally inferior. Green Cod is scarce, and has been placed at $\$ 5$ per barrel.

Asmes.-Pots have been in active demand throughout the week at gradually adrancing rates; sales of to-day are fully 15 cents above former quotations. Pearls romain nearly as last quoted; receipts small.
