- (10) The Governments agree to adopt a radio frequency standard baseline unit of time and to agree to adopt a radio frequency standard on the unit of time, and to compare at least once every six months, the actual radio frequency measuring standards.
- (11) The Governments agree to require all stations, other than mobile and amateur stations, under their jurisdiction, to tune their transmitters with accuracy of 0.025 per cent, or better, of their national frequency standard.
- (12) The Governments agree to require all stations likely to cause interpolations agree to require all stations likely to cause interpolations. national interference, other than mobile and amateur stations, to maintain the frequency with an accuracy of 0.05 per cent, or better, at all times.
