## RIDING MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK—LIGHTING PLANT

Mr. CLARKE (Rosedale):

1. What revenue was received in each of the years 1937 and 1938 by Riding Mountain national park, Wasagaming, Manitoba, from their lighting plant, from the following sources: (a) cottage owners; (b) stores; (c) hotels; (d) garages, or any other sources other than government buildings, street lights, etc.?

2. What amounts were paid for light supplied to the park's office, for street lights, government buildings, etc., during each of the years 1937 and 1938?

Mr. CRERAR:

1. Fiscal year 1936-37, \$2,296.36; (a, b, c, d) fiscal year 1937-38, \$2,908.79.

(Note.—No separate record is kept of the electric consumption under the headings asked for).

2. Amount credited to system for power used for street lighting which is at the same net rate as large consumers. Fiscal year 1936-37, \$536.04; fiscal year 1937-38, \$915.75. Amount credited to system for power used for government buildings, which is at the same net rate as large consumers.—Fiscal year 1936-37, \$1,027.26; fiscal year 1937-38, \$936.18.
