However, Mr. Speaker, because of antiquated procedural practices, not all of which are the fault of the opposition, the legislative process in the House of Commons sometimes grinds to a halt. The opposition obstructs, be it Conservative, NDP or Cr ditiste or even Liberal. The rules have not provided proper time limits for debate in the past. At last we have passed a reasonable rule creating limitation of debate.

In conclusion, Mr. Speaker, may I be permitted to say that fundamentally we will all have made a great contribution to the advancement of Canadian parliamentary democracy by supporting this motion.
