CONTRACT AWARDING PROCESS—MINISTER'S POSITION

Mr. John R. Rodriguez (Nickel Belt): Mr. Speaker, my question is directed to the Minister of Supply and Services. As is the case with all commitments in the Throne Speech, such an agency will be established.
