Objectionable speeches 38. All personal, sharp or taxing speeches are forbidden.

Redress of injured senator

39. A senator considering himself or herself offended or injured in the Senate, in a committee room, or in any of the rooms belonging to the Senate, may appeal to the Senate for redress.

Exceptionable words 40. (1) When a senator is called to order for words spoken in debate, such senator or any other senator may demand that the exceptionable words be taken down in writing by the Clerk at the Table.

Retraction and apologies

(2) A senator who has used exceptionable words and does not explain or retract the same or offer apologies therefor to the satisfaction of the Senate shall be dealt with as the Senate may think fit.

Intervention in disputes 41. The Senate may intervene to prevent the prosecution of any dispute between senators arising out of a debate or proceeding in the Senate or in ay Committee thereof.

Speaker addressing Senate 42. (1) The Speaker shall stand head uncovered when addressing the Senate.

Speaker participating in debate (2) The Speaker may participate in any debate other than a debate on a point of order, or a question of privilege, on which the Speaker is required to render a decision.

Speaker to leave Chair (3) If the Speaker participates in any debate in accordance with subsection (2), the Speaker shall leave the Chair and may call upon any senator to preside as Speaker until the Speaker resumes the Chair.
