Mr. Gardiner, in his elaborate preface, states that "There is something particularly pleasing in hearing the account given by the enemy of the continual and constant apprehensions of the garrison within the walls during the progress of the Siege." It is certainly an interesting journal, but it is made more valuable to the student by the copious notes which have been added by Mr. Gardiner, which afford positive evidence of the exact location of the battle.
