sesses but one bound volume of its complete proceedings. Several members of the Board of General Purposes have had their private copies bound. At my suggestion the Board of General Purposes placed at my disposal sufficient funds to bind some forty odd volumes of Proceedings of Sister Grand Lodges, thus forming the nucleus of a Grand Lodge Library, and I feel satisfied the Grand Lodge in its wisdom will see fit to grant further aid towards this object. I need not enlarge upon the practical value of having such books bound and handy for reference. In this connection I desire to express my appreciation of the kindness of Bro. James Staton, of Brooksville, Kentucky, for several valuable donations of proceedings and pamphlets.
