The following are the words rendered *torment* or *tormented* in the Authorised Version, with a complete list of the passages where they occur:—

*βάσανος* \* (*basanos*).

- Matt. iv. 24. With divers diseases and *torments*.  
 Luke xvi. 23. He lift up his eyes, being in *torments*.  
 „ xvi. 28. Lest they also come into this place of *torment*.

*βασανισμός* (*basanismos*).

- Rev. ix. 5. Their *torment* was as the *torment* of a scorpion.  
 „ xiv. 11. The smoke of their *torment* ascendeth.  
 „ xviii. 7. So much *torment* and sorrow give her.  
 „ xviii. 10. For the fear of her *torment*.  
 „ xviii. 15. For the fear of her *torment*.

*βασανίζω* (*basanizo*).

- Matt. viii. 6. Sick of the palsy, grievously *tormented*.  
 „ viii. 29. Art Thou come hither to *torment* us?  
 „ xiv. 24. Midst of the sea *tossed* with waves.  
 Mark v. 7. That Thou *torment* me not.  
 „ vi. 48. He saw them *toiling* in rowing.  
 Luke viii. 28. I beseech Thee *torment* me not.  
 2 Peter ii. 8. *Vexed* his righteous soul.

\* *βάσανος* is literally the touch-stone; then, a test, a trial whether a thing is genuine; then torture, tormenting disease, etc.
