

## McGILL UNIVERSITY, MONTREAL.

THE thirty-fourth session of the Medical Faculty of McGill University will be opened on Monday, 5th November, 1866, and will be continued during the six following months.

Matriculation examinations, as formerly, will be held during the first week of the session, and all students who have not previously matriculated, must present themselves for examination at the time above specified.

After the 1st May, 1867, the Faculty will require the matriculation examination recommended by the Council for Medical Education and Registration of Great Britain, and adopted in the amended Medical Act for Upper Canada. Examinations, in conformity therewith, will be held during the first weeks of May and November, 1867. The requirements of the new standard for matriculation are:—“Compulsory, English language, including grammar and composition; Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions; Algebra, including simple equations; Geometry, first two books of Euclid; Latin translation and grammar; and one of the following optional subjects: Greek, French, German, Natural philosophy, including mechanics, hydrostatics, and pneumatics. After 1869, Greek will be one of the compulsory subjects.
