

Estimating the salaries of Professors at two thousand dollars each, the amount required to be raised by collection is five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

The total sum required in order to maintain the existing state of things is, therefore, about twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). Should an additional Professor be appointed in Queen's College and Montreal College respectively, the amount would be increased to about \$30,000.

## II. RECOMMENDATIONS.

1. It is expedient that the territorial principle should, for the present, be adopted in the scheme for supporting the Theological Institutions of the Church.

2. The congregations in Maritime Provinces shall be the constituency for the support of the Theological Hall at Halifax.

3. The congregations in the Province of Quebec, and those in the Province of Ontario, on the east side of the St. Lawrence and Ottawa Railway, shall contribute towards the support of the Presbyterian College at Montreal; and those congregations west of the St. Lawrence and Ottawa Railway, shall contribute towards the support of Queen's College and Knox College.

4. Inasmuch as Myrrin College seeks no aid from the Church at present, the Committee make no recommendation concerning the mode of its support.

## III. THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION AND EXAMINATION OF STUDENTS.

After some conversation on the practice of the several Churches regarding Education for the Ministry and Examination of Students, it was agreed to appoint a small sub-committee to draft regulations on these subjects.

## IV. MANITOBA COLLEGE.

With reference to Manitoba College, as no opportunity had been afforded to the sub-Committee on Colleges of meeting with the sub-Committee on Home Missions, as had been directed, it was agreed that the resolution of the Committee, given below, be carried out, and that Manitoba College continue to be supported in the meantime from Home Mission funds,

After lengthened deliberation the following was adopted as the recommendation of the Committee.

1. "That Manitoba College should be maintained in efficiency.

2. "That, while in the meantime it is necessary that the funds of the Home Mission Committee shall be drawn upon for the support of this Institution, it is not desirable that this College shall continue to be a permanent charge upon the Home Mission Fund."

## VII. (1.) MINISTERS' WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This subject was, after explanations had been given regarding the Funds of the several Churches, referred to a Sub-Committee, who brought in a Report, which, after certain amendments had been made, was adopted, as follows, and the Committee resolved to recommend accordingly:—
