WATERVALE IS WINNER  
THE PREAKNESS STAKES

Zeus is Second in Feature on  
Closing Day at Pimlico—  
New Track Record.

BALTIMORE, May 17.—Beautiful weather and high-class racing marked the close of one of the most successful meetings held under the auspices of the Maryland Jockey Club. A banner crowd which swelled the card, the features of which were the Consolation Steeplechase, the New Howard Purse and the Preakness Stakes. Watervale, in winning the Preakness, broke the track record for every distance, clipping two-fifths of a second from the figure for a mile and a furlong. The much-heralded Overman, an odds-on favorite, was defeated in the first race.

### THE TRACK AT WOODBINE NEVER IN BETTER SHAPE

Railbirds Enjoy the Trainers' Derby That Is Won by Ondra—Horses From Baltimore.

So far the rain that has fallen has only been a whit slower than it was at its best. From continual pounding the track was loosing its spring, but now it is regaining it. A better made track, according to an experienced trainer, there never was than at Woodbine. It was told it had been made and his response was that all he could say was that extraordinary care must have been taken of it.

Yesterday morning was a field day with the trainers, who were all abroad putting finishing touches on the horse intended for Saturday's racing. The program for that day is an exceptionally good one, including, besides the King's Plate, the Minto Stakes, the Scarborough Steeplechase, the Woodstock Plate, second only in fame to the King's Plate, and three purses, each of the value of \$500. Altogether the O.J.C. adds \$3000 (upwards of \$1800 sterling), to the purses and stakes for the first day.

Yesterday morning the trainers had what they were pleased to call their Derby. It was really only a work-out, but for the spectators, who were fairly numerous, it possessed considerable interest, especially for those who can see in a horse's striving the highest pitch of an animal's peaceful effort. There were five starters and running bunched most of the way they finished with Harry Giddings' Ondra, a rare good one by the same token, in front. Detroit second, a nose away, with Sight practically on a level, and Indictus and Leonard Barry second on trailing. The time of the leaders for the half mile was 49 3/4, and it was good and might have been better, for the leaders had something left. The Woodstock Stakes' Lady Lorne gave a taste of her quality by going a mile in 1:45, the fractional times being: Quarter 33 3/4, three-furlongs 1:05, half
