CHICAGO HAS 87 DEAD. Chicago, July 11.—Eighty-seven people have died in this city from the effects of the heat since July 1. In addition to the list with 87 deaths, Cincinnati and suburban points reporting 65 and St. Louis 42. Throughout the South the heat was intense, but the death rate much lower than in the North.
