In the Criminal Assize Court yesterday two serious cases were disposed of. In both cases the charges were murder and the prisoners women, who had murdered persons who were dear to them.

Mrs. Burrell, the unfortunate woman who strangled her three children on Oct. 21, when seated in the prisoner's box, gazed wolldly about the room, and appeared to be entirely uninterested in the progress of the case.

She Said "Guilty."

Case of Minnie Saxton. When Minnie Saxton, charged with shoing her sister, Cusan Saxton, at Newm ket on Aug. 22, was brought into court looked extremely pale. The jury were challenged and the trial proceeded expedit

challenged and the trial proceeded expections.

Mr. E. F. B. Johnston, Q.C., who defended the accused, admitted the facts at the outset, and proposed to call witnesses to show that the pulsoner was not responsible for her act. The two women lived together on the best of terms until Susan Saxton told the accused that she was about to be married. This weighed upon Minnie Saxton's mind, which was never strong, and unbalanced it. She procured a revoiver, went into the kitchen and shot her sister four times.

Barrister Widdifield of Newmarket, who acted for the two women, spoke of the accused woman's affection for the deceased. On the day in question, Aug. 22, a servant working for the Saxtons ran into his office and told him that Minnie Saxton had shot her sister. When witness went in the accused said that she shot her sister in order that Mr. McMillan could not take her away.

The case was then concluded, and His Lordship explained that the Crown had been instrumental in fully establishing, the facts of the case, but that the defence had brought out clearly the irresponsibility of the accused. He saw plainly the jury's decision, and asked them if they were agreed that the woman was mentally afflicted so as to be irresponsible for the crime.

Each juror assented, and the judge committed Mrs. Burrell to the asylum to await the pleasure of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council.
