For the month of August 507 cars were inspected, 78 cars, or 64,740 bushels, grading No. 1 hard, 41 cars of this being raw wheat. The percentage of No. 1 hard wheat is shown up by Mr. Horn to be large and very satisfactory. On the lighter soil the grade grown is generally No. 1 northern. This disproves the statement made by some grain buyors that a large percentage, in fact the bulk of the wheat, would grade No. 1 northern instead of No. 1 hard.
