Monthly Drafts Thereafter Plan To Make Strain As Light As Possible.

WILL TRAIN OVERSEAS

Only Preliminary Work Will Be Carried On In Canada, Is Belief.

Men who are not within the age limits specified for the first class called under the military service act may volunteer after it is in effect, camp orders issued here today state. They urge further that such men be encouraged to join the army.

It is contemplated that on the issue of the proclamation of the military service act calling up all men between the ages of 20 and 34, the draft-giving depots and C. E. F. companies now in existence will automatically cease recruiting operations, today's orders announce. In the meantime no further appointments to the recruiting staffs of these units will be made and no new recruiting plans will be put into operation.

Fifteen hundred men will be called up for the draft in this district, it is estimated, although subsequent drafts will make the total of drafted men from this district much greater. It is understood that the instruction of the new recruits in Canada will be of an elementary nature only. All the advanced work and special training will be carried on in England where the facilities for such training are the best. For some time past the training of recruits all over the Empire has followed a syllabus that is supposed to take about fourteen weeks.
