**HEAVY CORN SALES PUT DOWN PRICES** 

Oats Also Make Fractional Decline in Chicago

Chicago, Oct. 28.—Prospects of larger receipts from the new crop led to heavy selling of corn yesterday, and made prices average lower. The market closed unsettled at the same as yesterday's finish, to 3/c down, with December at \$1.15½ to \$1.18½, and May at \$1.12½. Oats declined ½c to %c. The result in provisions varied from 2½c drop to a rise of 60c.

Railway embargoes nampering shipments to the seaboard depressed the oats market, and so, too, did the downward tendency of corn.

Provisions advanced, owing to continued scarcity of, hog arrivals. In the last hour, the realizing sales by holders wiped out mest of the gains.

BUYERS BOOST POTATO PRICE. Brockville, Oct. 28.—Buyers boosted the price of potatoes on the Brockville market Saturday, picking up wagonload lots, to the exclusion of householders. Quotations jumped from 60c to \$1.50 per bushel, and the yield in the section which supplies Brockville was never greater.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Al-

land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-

good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre.
