

SCOTIA COMPANY BROKE PREVIOUS RECORDS IN 1908

Nearly 700,000 Tons Shipped During the Year-Other Departments Show Gratifying Results

(North Sydney Herald).

Everything considered the output of the different colleries of the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company for the month of December was much in excess of the officials' anticipations. Considerable duliness prevailed during the thirty-one days of the last month of 1908, owing to non-shipments of coal, but the figures totalled up an output of 49,232 tons, every pound of which was shipped from the North Sydney pier of the company. In iron the output was 6,000 tons, and steel 5,000 tons, besides 8,000 tons of coke. In all the total output from the five collieries of the big concern for the year 1908, was by all means the largest ever turned out on this side the water, amounting to the magnificent total of 680,772 tons,
