to have reached, by subscriptions and donations, the sum of £20,-000, old currency, and that the interest will thenceforth be available. The first claim upon it will be to make up what is wanting in the Block Sum. If this Society be thus relieved from any payment to that fund, there will be something more than usual at the disposal of the Committee for the support of Missionaries.

The Committee acknowledge the receipt of \$1200, as a legacy by the late Honble. M. B. Almon, long a Vice-President of the Society; another, also, of \$100 has been left by the late Miss Sterns, of Liverpool.
