Annual Report of Chief D. W. Simpson

SOME COMPARISONS

Recommendations as to Bread Shops—The Work of the Children's Aid Society Gone Into and Commended

H. R. McLellan, Commissioner of Public Safety, has received the annual police report from Chief D. W. Simpson. The report is a lengthy one, covering every phase of the police work in the city and is thorough in every respect. It shows a total of forty-nine men on the force on Dec. 31, as on the force a year ago. The estimated population of the city, according to the railway company's statistics is placed at 60,000 with twenty-one square miles of territory. This gives one policeman to each 1276 of the population.

CHAPLAIN HOOVER'S FUND
FOR WOUNDED SOLDIERS

The value of lost property recovered during the year reached \$10,118.60. The work of the police matron has increased considerably over that of the previous year on account of the number of cases being cared for by the Children's Aid Society.

Bread Inspector John O'Neill, in his report to the chief, finds that the bread law is being well carried out and that all proprietors are willing to adhere to its conditions. Inspector O'Neill has made tests of all boarding and lodging houses to keep a register wherein there should be recorded the names, former place of residence, date of arrival, date of departure of all lodgers and boarders and that this register be open to the inspection of any police constable employed by the city.

Some comment, says the chief, has been made that crime is on the increase in the city, but I am bound to point out that it is not so. The increase in the number of crimes and offences, and the only increase is shown in juvenile delinquency, which gives us cause for concern. The increase of last year, however, is easily offset by the entire absence of any one serious crime.

Cleaning Up. The report referring to the Children's Aid Society says:—A great amount of work was accomplished during the last year, which has fallen very heavily on my detectives, and the police generally, who have carried on the work independently of an agent, but ably assisted by the society's officers.

A. M. Belding, the president of the society, although a very busy man, and attached to enterprises demanding his greater part of his time, has been available on all occasions when called upon and spent much of his time in the most worthy object—the welfare of the neglected little ones, whom circumstances have deprived of their parents' care. He has supported us greatly in the work of cleaning up some of the deplorable conditions found to exist in the city.

The Rev. W. R. Robinson, the secretary, has been untiring in his efforts in this work, and I am glad to say that by his assistance and co-operation, to which he has given his valuable time both night and day. Many nights when asleep in bed, I have had to call on my office to arrange for the care of some unfortunate and without hesitation responded to the call, the result being that the children were brought to light by the police in the small hours of the morning when houses were being visited on various occasions the commissioner of public safety has also called at my office as late as one, two, three, and four o'clock in the morning, and on various occasions, through kindness, providing cots, I have been able to leave little children at the station, although of about 100 children.

In this regard I cannot speak too highly of the assistance rendered by the Rev. Father Duke, and the supervisors of the Roman Catholic institutions of the city, who have shown their willingness to do all in their power to assist in the care of children regardless of creed; and at the Home of the Sacred Heart, which has been cared for when no other door was open for their assistance.

Our record shows that an aggregate of some two hundred families have been reported by the police with conditions prevailing that required immediate attention and, there being no agent of the society appointed, this work was generally done by the detectives and police until the arrival of the Rev. W. R. Robinson, who then took charge of the children and by this means a work of paramount importance has been carried out during the year, involving the conditions of about 600 children.

The above, generally speaking, were those coming under the Children's Protection Act, and we have all been greatly handicapped both by the need of a suitable home and a juvenile court. In speaking of the juvenile court, the juvenile court has so well made in this city, being yet only on the eve of its inception in this province, the report discusses the juvenile court question and its way of dealing with delinquents. The chief favors the appliance of the rod rather than soft words and letting offenders go. He advocates the use of a broader discrimination in dealing with the various types of juvenile delinquents.

HON. MR. HAZEN WILL
BE DEPUTY LEADER

Ottawa, Jan. 20.—Following the presentation of the speech from the throne yesterday afternoon, parliament settled down to business. One of the interesting developments of the session was the fact that Hon. J. D. Hazen has been elected to the seat next the leader, left of center, in the House of Commons. His elevation over Hon. W. T. White, minister of finance, indicates that the premier is not anxious to have such a dangerous character as the latter too near the seat of power. Hon. Mr. Hazen will act as leader during the absence of the premier.

The special committee named to draft the standing committee for the session includes John Stanfield and considerable amusement was experienced in the Pugsley queried, in apparent amazement, if this was the late chief whip.
