LIQUOR LICENSES

More Than 90 Percent of Dealers Apply-Buying of Wet Good Against the Drouth Particularly

It is impossible, so the members of the Licensing Board say, to continue this special arrangement of granting monthly licenses to applicants, and the licenses which are now being sought will cover the period from July I until May 1, 1920.

All persons who apply for such licenses are plainly warned, however, that they can be granted only subject to federal control. Even though the city may grant a license extending from July 1, 1919, to May 1, 1920, the license is absolutely void until war prohibition is repealed and will become void once more after that repeal if Jan. 16, 1920, arrives without any repeal of national prohibition.
