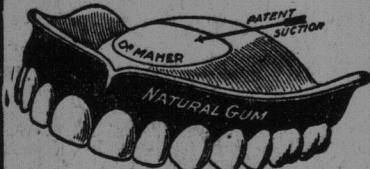

**WAR VETERANS OF  
PROVINCE ORGANIZE**

Warder, St. Stephen; L. Lewar, Campbellton; George Power, Moncton, and A. Ashford, Fredericton.

**MONCTON BRANCH OF  
THE NAVY LEAGUE**

The new branch of the Navy League of Canada, formed last week at Moncton at a citizens' meeting called by the mayor, heard an address by Colonel R. T. Sturdee, president of the New Brunswick division. He told of the existence of the navy league in England for the last twenty years, and how much it had done to stir up public opinion and the government, on the importance of sea power. He said it was due to the efforts of the Navy League that the "two to one" standard was adopted, that is, to build two British warships to every one that Germany built, and the result was shown when war broke out, as the British fleet was ready. He also gave out the objects of the Navy League, and showed what they were doing in education, charitable and patriotic work. After a general discussion it was resolved that those present should form a branch of the Navy League, and officers were elected as follows: President, the mayor, John B. Toombs; vice-president, Captain Masters; secretary, G. S. Smith; treasurer, A. J. Macquarrie; executive consisting of the regent of the I. O. D. E., the presidents of the local Red Cross, and the Patriotic League, and several prominent citizens, the number to be completed later by the executive. Enrollment then began and all present paid their fees, while it was announced that Fort Cumberland Chapter I. O. D. E. would join in a body, it is expected that the Moncton branch will soon number 500 members. Fredericton branch held a campaign last week and secured several hundred new members, while their gathering of children at the Opera House resulted in more than 400 joining as junior members. **DISCIPLINE WAS SPLENDID  
WHEN STEAMER STRUCK**

A Canadian Atlantic Port, July 7.—When the Hall liner, City of Vienna, with 1,400 Canadian troops consisting of various drafts and details on board, ran ashore on a dangerous rock near here in a thick fog, it was at first feared that there might be a considerable loss of life. There was a heavy on-shore swell and the steamer, exposed to the full force of every wave, was in danger, it was thought, of speedily breaking up, but the troops and men have all been safely landed and the ship herself still holds together so there is even a possibility of saving her. One of the ship's officers told the Canadian Press that the discipline of the troops when the steamer struck was splendid. There was no sign of excitement, or confusion, he said, and the men formed up and obeyed orders as precisely as if they were on parade. On Saturday night a fire broke out in the Masonic Temple in Gormain street and did damage to the extent of \$700. The loss is covered by insurance. The fire originated in the janitor's closet. The lower floor of the building is occupied by the militia.
