INSTALLMENT PLAN

Payne, has submitted a proposal to her creditors, by the terms of which she will pay all of her debts on the installment plan. The proposal followed the filing of an involuntary petition in bankruptcy by Simon Lind with a claim of \$20,000. Mrs. Carter's liabilities are stated to be about \$20,000, or assets less than \$1,000.

BREAD LAWS FOR QUEBEC
Quebec, Feb. 7.—(Canadian Press)—Mr. Francoeur of L'Assommoir yesterday afternoon introduced in the legislature his bill providing regulations governing the quality and weight of bread in rural municipalities. A license for each municipality is provided for by the measure, which also authorizes six, four, three, two and one-pound loaves, which must be labelled showing weight.

BENEFITS IN
ST. JOHN CITY

Mr. Sherman Gives Convincing Address at Meeting of Citizens in Opera House—Questions Bring Out Much of Interest

The benefits of government by commission were clearly set out before a representative audience in the Opera House last evening by Ernest A. Sherman, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa. W. H. Barnaby, president, Mr. Sherman first showed the inadequacy and lack of good results in the system of municipal government by mayor and ward aldermen.

Mr. Sherman then proceeded to explain how the commission plan was evolved in Galveston, Texas, to tide over the emergency created by the great flood there. While the idea originated with an appointive commission, it had developed into an elective one.

The Galveston commissioners were not required to give all their time to the work and were not paid very high salaries. In Houston, the commissioners were paid a little higher salary and had to devote their whole time to the city's work.

The introduction of the commission plan into Des Moines and Cedar Rapids, Iowa, was next referred to, and the working of the initiative, referendum and recall, explained. One provision of the legislation passed in Iowa was that after six years the city could, if it wished, vote to re-institute the mayor and ward aldermen.

There was nothing revolutionary in the commission plan. Its method of election by primary was like the town meeting in New England.

Many honestly opposed the plan. It was not an experiment, for many years ago it had been tried in various cities. As to the argument that it was unconstitutional, he said this was ridiculous as it had been shown that it was constitutional in every way.



WILL HAVE RECIPROcity,
SAYS GOVERNOR FOSS

Massachusetts Real Estate Exchange Applaud Message From Taft Urging the Tariff Agreement

(Canadian Press) Boston, Mass., Feb. 6.—Urging the proposed reciprocity agreement with Canada, a message from President Taft was read over the long distance telephone by his secretary, Charles D. Norton, to the members of the Massachusetts Real Estate Exchange, assembled at their annual banquet in the Hotel Somerset last night.

"I note that the subject for discussion is New England welfare. I believe that the welfare of New England is the same as the welfare of the nation, and that both require the approval of Canadian reciprocity."

"We shall have reciprocity," said Governor Fox. "We may not get it this winter, but it is coming. The people are demanding it. We may have to reconstruct the United States senate to get it; but the people are already at work on that job, and with the direct election of senators by the people, the people at last will get their wishes carried into effect."

"I am personally in favor of reciprocity," declared Governor Potter of Rhode Island. Lamp burners should be washed frequently to remove dust and carbon that choke the perforations. Occasionally they should be boiled in a washing soda solution.
