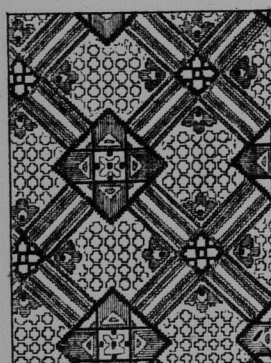

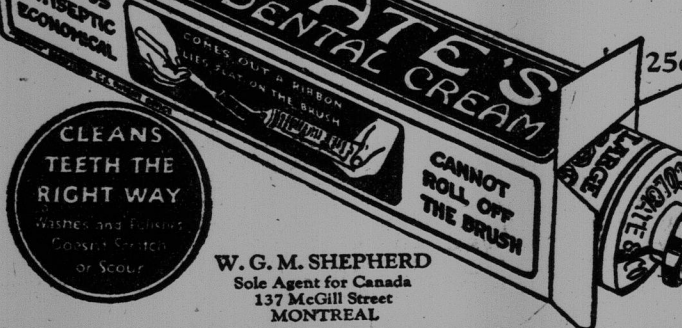

### JAZZ DRUMMER IS ESCAPED LUNATIC

London, April 19.—(By Mail)—Nathan Keplovitch, the escaped lunatic, has been secured by detectives at Whitechapel.

A former "jazz" drummer, Keplovitch has twice escaped from the Spring Mental Hospital, Upper Tooting. Sentenced at the Middlesex sessions last September to 20 months imprisonment for stealing a diamond ring from a girl at Criklewood, Keplovitch came insane while in prison, and was removed to the Springfield Hospital. During his period of liberty he has sent a number of threatening letters to various official persons. He is a Russian subject.

The mother, which arrived recently, very carefully made their toilets with her tongue and then left them alone. The keeper packed the black and yellow mites in a cardboard box and removed them.



### AGED BANDSMAN DEAD.

James Russell Was Indian Mutiny Veteran—Well-Known Musician.

Toronto, May 2.—Well-known in militia ranks and in the Musicians' Union, James Russell, of 1064 St. Charles avenue died here recently. He was in his 82nd year, and had been in very poor health for three years, death being due to old age. In appearance he was very much like the late Lord Roberts, and was affectionately called by that name.

Born in Ireland, he served ten years with the 53rd Shropshires, and served for three years in the Indian Mutiny, during which time he took part in the Relief of Lucknow. He was one of the few survivors of Sir Gordon Campbell's command which earned undying fame there.

His regiment was sent to Canada when the Fenian Raid broke out, but did not arrive in time to take part in the active fighting, and was stationed first at London, Ont., and then at Quebec, Canada.

### WORLD'S LARGEST VAT HOLDS 66,250 GALLONS OF BEER

Lahr, Baden, May 2.—The famous Heidelberg tub, whose capacity is 66,250 gallons, has been dedicated as the world's "king of casks."

Its successor, capable of holding 66,250 gallons, has just been completed by a coöperage firm here for an enterprise which plans to produce alcoholic spirits after a new process.

The giant new hoghead measures 24 feet 6 inches across and stands some 21 feet high. Its twelve great metal bands alone weigh approximately three tons, while the staves are more than four inches thick and the bottom has a thickness of more than five inches.

Thirty cubic meters of wood were required to turn out the tub.

Its 250 cubic meters in capacity would suffice to provide 1,200 persons with bath water and it would hold enough beer to supply the average German family for 1,000 years.

### ATLANTIC FLIGHT HERO WILL MARRY

London, April 19.—(By mail)—The engagement is announced of Commander Kenneth Mackenzie-Grieve, A. F. C., R. N., who acted as pilot for Mr. Hawker in his daring attempt to fly the Atlantic, and Janet, youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clinton Baddeley of Didsbury, Lancs.

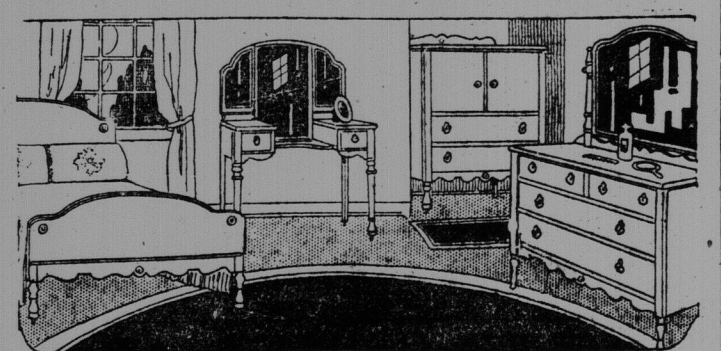

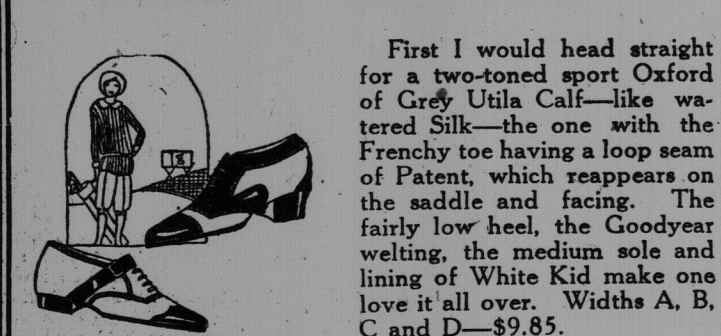
