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MANNISH GIRLS NO LONGER FASHIONABLE--MUCH TRIMMING ON NEW SUITS FOR LATE FALL WEAR



Black velvet, with sash and embroidery.

Violet Costume of the new permo fabric.

Before fur coats or long heavy cloth ones, are donned many pretty street suits are seen. The day of the strictly tailored suits with its mannish severity, seems to be over. A few girls and matrons will stick to extremely plain street suits but the feminine element is felt on every side. Nowhere is it more visible than in the coat or jacket. These outer garments are much trimmed and are elaborate with silk, velvet, sashes and fringe. This trimming extends even where the coat itself is of cloth.

Black velvet trimmings and an East Indian sash and motifs of colored embroidery are the strong features of a handsome tailored suit of black cloth. The underskirt is of black velvet about eight inches of this rich fabric showing. A tuck two inches deep in-

ishes the black cloth overskirt. The velvet appears in a deep collar which comes to the waistline of the coat and this collar in turn is trimmed with an inch width of the cloth.

Velvet and cloth cuffs are upon the sleeves. A black satin suit is finished with heavy fringe and the motifs of colored embroidery decorate the front of the coat.

Buttons are used elaborately as trimming upon a handsome dark blue satin costume. A graceful sash in the back of the satin is edged on both sides with the buttons and finished with fringe. The sash is double in effect. The blouse has a tunic effect and ends at the hips. It is trimmed with a wide white collar and cuffs. The bands of satin appear twice on the jacket's edge and also on the belt. A broad muslin collar is inside of the coat and the undersleeves are of the same soft material.

This material is one of the new ones of the autumn and is making a strong bid for popularity. It is a simple mixture of wool and mohair threads.

The street costume of violet shows the fringe trimming of the early Victorian day and the other feature of that time is the bell-sleeve over a wide undersleeve, the diagonal overskirt and the shortwaisted corded jacket.

The diagonal overskirt is edged with two lines of narrow violet fringe, this being headed with narrow bias bands. The sash is made of the same material and appears twice on the jacket's edge and also on the belt. A broad muslin collar is inside of the coat and the undersleeves are of the same soft material.
