### **ENGLISH PEOPLE STRONGLY** SUPPORT TRADE AGREEMENT

Portsmouth, Eng., Sept. 5-The feature of today's meeting of the British Association, was a paper on the subject of reciprocity between Canada and the United States, read by Charles E. Mallet, ex-financial secretary of the war office, and former member of parliament for Plymouth.

Mr. Mallet strongly approved of the Canadian-American agreement, and derided the suggestion that it would lead to annexation. "The Canadian nationality is far too great a living force today," the speaker said, "to be swallowed up in the United

Mr. Mallet maintained that if Great Britain attempted to interfere with the Canadian arrangement the government would not only be violating one of the first maxims of the British Empire, namely, fiscal freedom for the self-governing dominions, but it would "be asking the greatest British colony to turn her back on the greatest market of the world." The speaker argued that anything which increased the national development of Canada would be a source of Imperial strength.
