Earle Williams Shows Better Quality in Portraying Crook.

Old Sleuth, the expert one can always find at police headquarters, whose head is full of philosophy, will testify that a morally warped brain has no limit of treachery. The criminologist and all the books written on the subject affirm that when moral fever has gone from the brain the possessor cannot think an honest thought.

The Vitaphone has presented to the screen a powerful demonstration of this argument in its feature, "The Hornet's Nest," which features Earle Williams. The picture will be shown at the Star theatre on Mon., Tues. and Wed.

Mr. Williams represents the highest type of chivalry and right thinking, though his role requires his impersonation of a crook. IN THE DAY'S NEWS

William G. Lee, president of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, who is acting as one of the chief spokesmen for the railroad workers in the controversy over the railroad legislation now before Congress, is 60 years old to-day, having been born at La Prairie, Ill., Nov. 29, 1859. Mr. Lee began his working career as a brakeman on the Archison, Topeka and Santa Fe railroad, and until 1884 continued in that role. For the next four years he was a county official in Kansas. Then he resumed railroad work as a conductor on the Union Pacific, and soon became conspicuous as an organizer of the men. From 1895 to 1909 he was vice-president of the order of which, since 1909, he has been president. He is of a positive, aggressive type, possesses unusual executive capacity, and, by his record in negotiations with the railroad managers, has aided in building up a marked degree of loyalty in the rank and file of the trainmen.

1819—Cyrus W. Field, projector of the Atlantic cable, born at Stockbridge, Mass. Died at Ardsley, N.Y., July 12, 1892.
1882—Daniel Tyler, the veteran officer who commanded the first division of the Union army that advanced to defeat at Bull Run, died in New York City. Born at Brooklyn, Conn., Jan. 7, 1799.

1900—Lord Roberts relinquished the command in South Africa to Lord Kitchener.

In the legislature elections soon to be held in Jamaica the women of that island are to be privileged to vote for the first time. Under a new law every woman is entitled to the franchise who is 25 years of age or more, can read and write, and is of British nationality, providing also that she possesses certain property or salary qualifications.
