GENERAL STRIKE OF ALL WORKERS IN OLD FRANCE

Laborers Throw Down Their Tools for a Day to Show Their Power and Influence

COULD PARALYZE GOVERNMENT EFFORTS

Many Mass Meetings Held in Paris and Throughout the Provinces

Paris, Dec. 16-A general strike of the whole of the working population of France was ordered to be carried of France was ordered to be carried out today by the general Federation of Labor, as a protest against laws partially unsuccessful. It was understood that all workmen were to throw down their tools for one day only, in order to show the strength of the laboring classes and to demnstrate their power of paralyzing the government in the event of a declaration of war. In Paris itself, men appeared to have executed the order to strike in a great many instances. Few cabs or other vehicles ware on the streets, while many factories were closed and the whole of the men connected with the diay.
