

Colona, California. Is a merchant miller. Has been a mem. of the Town Council of Chatham for several years, Deputy Reeve of Chatham in the Co. Council, and Chairman of the Finance Committees. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1887. Unseated in Nov., 1887, but re-elected 2nd May, 1888. Re-elected at g. e., 1891 and 1896. A Liberal, and strongly in favor of reciprocity with the United States upon fair and equal terms.—*Toronto Junction, Ont.*

CARGILL, HENRY (*East Bruce*).

Father and mother, natives of the Co. of Antrim, Irel., settled in the Co. of Halton, Ont., about 65 years ago. Born in the Tp. of Nassagaweya, Co. of Halton, and ed. there and at Queen's Coll., Kingston, Ont. M., 13 March, 1864, Margaret Davidson, Co. of Halton. Is a manufacturer of lumber and general merchant. Has been postmaster of Cargill. Is Reeve of the Tp. of Greenock. First returned to Commons at g. e., 1887. Resigned and was re-elected 2 April, 1887. An unsuccessful candidate at g. e., 1891, re-elected at by-election held 1892, and again at g. e., 1896. A Conservative.—*Cargill, Ont.*

CARON, *Hon.* SIR JOSEPH PHILIPPE HENÉ ADOLPHE, K.C.M.G., Q.C., P.C. (*Three Rivers*).

Eldest surviving s. of the late Hon. R. E. Caron, Lieut.-Governor of the Prov. of Quebec. Born in the City of Quebec, 24 Dec., 1843. Ed. at the Seminary of Quebec, at Laval Univ. and at McGill Univ., at which last institution he graduated B.C.L., 1865. M., 25 June, 1867, Alice, only dau. of the late Hon. Francois Baby, who represented Stadacona division in L. C. of Can. for several years. Studied law with L. C. Baillarge, Esq., Q.C., and subsequently with the late Hon. Sir John Rose, Bart., and was called to the Bar, L.C., 1865. Apptd. a Q.C., 19 May, 1879. Was a dir. of the Stadacona Bank, and in 1867 was Vice-Presdt. of the Literary and Historical Soc. of Quebec. Sworn of the Privy Council, and was Minister of the Militia, from 9 Nov., 1880, to 25 Jan., 1892, when he became Postmaster Gen. Continued a mem. of the Abbott, Thompson and Howell Administrations, until 27 April, 1896, when he retired with his Leader. Created a K.C.M.G., 25 Aug., 1885, in recognition of his services in aiding in the suppression of
