ved on Board any of Her Pajellies Ships of War, or any Privateer or Perchant, or Trading Ship or Ships, Aevel or Acutels, which at the time of luch Service wall belong to any of Her Pajelies Gies Subjects of Great Britain for the space of Two Pears, thail, to all intents and purposes, be decreed and taken to be a Matural Voin Subject of Her Pajellies Kingdom of Great Britain, and have and enjoy all the Privileges, Powers, Rights and Capacities which such foreign Pariner or Seaman could, thous or ought to have had and enjoyed, in case he had been a Matural Born Subject of Her Pajellies, and Adually a Native within the Kingdom of Great Britain.

And for the more expeditious Probiting of Ships and Gellels to be Equipped and Aled as and for Privateers for the speedy Annoping her Majesties Enemies, and putting in Execution the Purpoles by this Ad intended, Be it further Enaded by the Authority aforefaid, Chat it hall and may be Lawful for Her Wajetly, Her heirs and Successors, to Grant to any Person or Persons who thall be adually ingaged in any Adventure, in pursuance of this Aa, a Licence to buy og procure in any Foreign Parts, any Ship or Ships (first giving Security to Her Wajesty, that such Ship and Ships Hall be imployed in such Adventures ) so as the whole Rumber of Fozeign Ships to to be Bought and Licented, Hall not erceed the Mumber of Twenty; And that such Ships which shall be so Bought by Licence of Her Majesty, as asozelaid (having been Equipped, Set out, and Imployed as Privateers, during the continuance of the present War) hall (after the same War ended) be to all intents and purpoles deemed and taken as Ships of Bruish Built, and have all the Privileges of Ships Built in any Part of Great Britain, and be capable of being used and imployed according. ly; The faid Ad made in the faid Twelfth Pear of the Reign of his late Hajesty King Charles the Second, Intituled, An Act for the Encrease and Encouragement of Shipping and Navigation, or any other Statute or Law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Provided always, and be it further Enaded and Declared, Chat it hall and may be lawful to and for all her Pajestles Subjects of this Kingdom, to Trade into any Part of America, to which they might lawfully have Traded before the making of this Ad, and not

otherwife.

Provided always, That nothing in this Aā chall any ways extend, or de confixued to take away or prejudice any of the Chate, Rights or Privileges of or belonging to the Sovernor and Company of Adbenturers of England Crading into Hudson's-Bay.
