Your letter of recent date to hand re Canadian Industrial Disputes Act. I may say that I have had considerable experience in connection with this Act and have proven it to be the most beneficial piece of legislation placed upon the Statute Books of recent years in connection with labour.

I know that the above act could be amended as to be more satisfactory to both employer and employee. If there was a Board appointed for each Province or District. This board could be called together in say three or four days instead of taking a month such as is done at present.

I believe it could be applied to every industry and with great advantage to labour.
