Deliveries of new aircraft from Canadian industrial plants are now coming along regularly.

Reserves of ammunition have been accumulated.

The Air Service has been placed upon a basis of equality with the older services. The head of the air force now has the title of Chief of the Air Staff and sits in defence council as a member equal in standing to the Chiefs of the General and Naval Staffs.

The R.C.A.F. has been re-organized for administrative purposes into three area commands, a Western Command, an Eastern Command, and a Central or Training Command.

New Air Stations for the defence of the Pacific Coast have been established at Patricia Bay on Vancouver Island, Aliford Bay in the Queen Charlotte Islands and Prince Rupert. The existing station at Jericho Beach, Vancouver, has been greatly enlarged. A reserve magazine remove from enemy action has been established at Kamloops, B.C.

New air stations for the defence of the Atlantic Coast have been established at Sydney, Truro and Yarmouth, Nova Scotia. The existing station at Dartmouth has been greatly enlarged.
