
Ottawa, 10th October 1916.

Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 26th ultimo regarding road work to be done on the front road in the Sarnia Indian Reserve, it is noted that there is a balance of about \$169.62 to be paid for work which has already been done. Your statement evidently included the sum of \$2.93 which is left over from a cheque of \$300.00 from band funds sent to Indian Agent, T. Maxwell. In order to properly adjust these accounts it will be necessary for you to send in a receipt for \$2.93 on a separate pay-sheet.

A cheque for \$400.00 is being sent Mr. Maxwell to-day under separate cover. With this amount the men will be paid for the work already done. Then the troughs are to be constructed and the balance is to be used for ditching and grading on the front road as soon as conditions of the soil are suitable for this work to be done in an economical manner.
