Dear Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated July 20th, file 61/L/3, with two cheques mentioned therein. These have been handed to the Indians mentioned by you and their receipts, duly witnessed by Mr. Caldwell, are enclosed herewith. I should advise you that Dan Daniels stated that in his conversation with you recently, which was interpreted by Constable O'Connell, he was given to understand that the shares would be \$11.00 each and expressed his disappointment that the amounts sent were so much less, these being \$4.66 and \$2.34, respectively, the former in favor of Dan Daniels and the latter in favor of Annie Wengess. Mr. O'Connell, who was here today, was under the same impression as the Indian.
