P R E F A C E.

The following pages contain what is believed to be a fair and candid synopsis of the arguments used on both sides in the debate. The notes are necessarily brief, having been taken for publication in the columns of the local newspaper, but it is believed that their perusal will give a just idea of the arguments.

The discussion arose through the acceptance in a friendly spirit of a challenge given by the friends of Mr. Dunn, who consequently took the affirmative of the proposition. The proceedings of each evening were opened by Mr. Dunn, who spoke half an hour, followed by Dr. Washington for half an hour, when each speaker again occupied half an hour, which terminated the debate for the evening.
