REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Demistrion Leads in Mantible on the North-west Torritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood-lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be and to be a family, or any make over all years of age, to the extent of one-quarter sec-tion of 162 area, more of less.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least aix months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any pursue who is eligible to the Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a house-stack, the requiremental the second such as the control of th

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themsamer pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entary for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "ricinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisi-of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 ac of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of sto with buildings for their accommodation, a have besides 20 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply the requirements of the homesteader is liable to have his cirty cancelled, and the may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making applies to the product of the sub-Agent of the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
