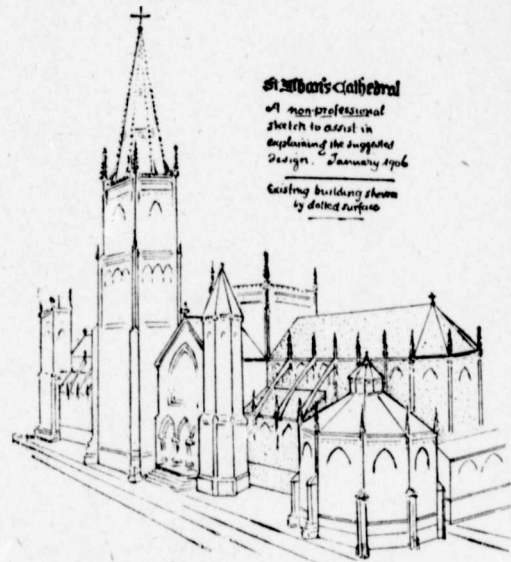

A meeting of the Residuary Chapter was held on Thursday 1st of March, to consider an offer from Mr. Frank Turner of a memorial stained glass window. The offer was accepted and it was ordered that the thanks of the Chapter should be conveyed to Mr. Turner.

The Bishop's Envelope Fund for the past year shews an increase, but the amount is still far short of what his Lordship expects from the people of the Diocese.

With this number of the NOTES we issue a copy of the ground plan of the Cathedral, shewing the part now built, the proposed extension, and the remainder which is for the future. The extension now proposed would, with the present building, seat 1200 people. The School Pier, the Children's Pier, and the Women's Pier are each marked on this plan. The accompanying sketch was made for the purpose of helping to an understanding of

the plan by shewing in a general way the kind of building which it suggests. It must be understood however that this sketch has not been made by the architects or under their direction, but is altogether non-professional. No part of the super-structure has as yet been designed.



We are informed that the Ladies of the League have been very active and successful, and what they have undertaken seems pretty certain to be carried through. But the men of the Congregation, of whom so much has been expected, seem to be going their part in a very leisurely manner: and meanwhile the time is slipping away. It would be gratifying if our next number should be able to mention more activity on their part.
